FACT SHEET FOR APPLICANTS FOR A COLORADO MASONS' BENEVOLENT FUND VOCATIONAL GRANT

PURPOSE: These grants are intended to provide financial assistance to deserving students. They are not intended to cover all expenses. In your planning, you should not assume that a grant has been awarded until you are officially notified by the grant administrator or the grant committee. We expect decisions to be made and notifications to be sent out late in May 2019.

AWARD: Award amounts are not determined by the Board until at least February each year. Last year, we awarded one-time grants of \$1000. These grants are intended to assist in obtaining vocational skill from an accredited vocational training program within the State of Colorado. The program must be accredited by a recognized accreditation committee. Grants are awarded without reference to race, religion, sex, national origin or Masonic relationship.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS:

1. You must be a graduating Colorado Public High School Senior.
2. You must be a citizen of the United States of America.
3. You must attend an vocational institution within the State of Colorado.
4. Completed applications must be submitted by March 15 to be considered.

CHECKLIST: (Please arrange your application packet in this order.)

1. Complete all four pages of the application form. It must be signed by both applicant and parent/guardian.
2. Write a personal letter which includes the following topics:
 - a. Your goals and objectives for the future.
 - b. Why you require financial assistance.
 - c. Why you feel you should be selected for our scholarship.
3. A grade transcript covering your entire high school career, including your GPA and class rank.
4. A letter of acceptance from the university, college or institution of higher learning listed on the application.
5. A copy of the Student Aid Report (SAR) from your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
6. Four letters of recommendation. (Letters should be from personal acquaintances, employers, clergy, or teachers, preferably who have known you or your family over a period of time. It is best not to have all the letters from teachers. Letters will be reviewed by the Lodge interview committee.

7. You must arrange for a personal interview with members of the Masonic Lodge assigned to your high school. On our website page (www.grandlodgeofcolorado.org/philanthropy/scholarships), a contact form is at the bottom of the page. There is with a drop down to choose your school. Fill out the rest of the form and click 'submit' to make contact with the Lodge assigned to your school. A local lodge representative will contact you to set up an interview. Your application and all required documents must be available for review at your interview. The Lodge will send an interview letter to the selection committee separately.
8. Following the interview, please submit your complete application and required documents to:

All Grant money will be paid through and managed by the Student Aid Office of the vocational institution.

Your application packet will not be returned to you; in the event that you are not a selected recipient, all documents are destroyed at the end of our committee's selection process.

4. A letter of acceptance from the approved vocational training program listed on the application.
5. A copy of your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report (SAR).
6. Four (4) Letters of Recommendation should accompany the application. Letters should be from personal acquaintances, employers, clergy or teachers. It is best not to have all the letters from teachers. They should be from people who have known your family over a period of time. Letters need not be in separate envelopes.
7. You must arrange for a personal interview with one of the members of the Masonic Lodge that sponsor's your high school, as listed on our website at cmbfa.org. Please make contact with your Lodge as soon as possible, as interview dates may be preselected but the Lodge. Lodge contact information can be found on our website, www.cmbfa.org. You should complete checklist items 1 thru 6 prior to the interview and have them available at the interview.

FACT SHEET FOR APPLICANTS OF COLORADO MASONS' BENEVOLENT FUND SCHOLARSHIP

PURPOSE: These scholarships are intended to provide financial assistance to deserving students. They are not intended to cover all expenses. In your planning, you should not assume that a scholarship has been awarded until you are officially notified by the scholarship administrator or the scholarship committee. We expect decisions to be made and notifications to be sent out late in May 2019. After acceptances are received, recipients will be posted on the web-site.

AWARD: Award amounts are not determined by the Board until at least February each year. In the past, we have awarded scholarships up to \$7,000 per year, which are renewable for up to 4 years. These scholarships are intended to assist in obtaining an undergraduate degree from a university or college, or training in other accredited schools of higher education within the State of Colorado. Scholarships are awarded without reference to race, religion, sex, national origin or Masonic relationship.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS:

1. You must be a graduating Colorado Public High School Senior.
2. You must be a citizen of the United States of America.
3. You must attend an institution of higher education within the State of Colorado.
4. Completed applications must be submitted by March 15 to be considered.
